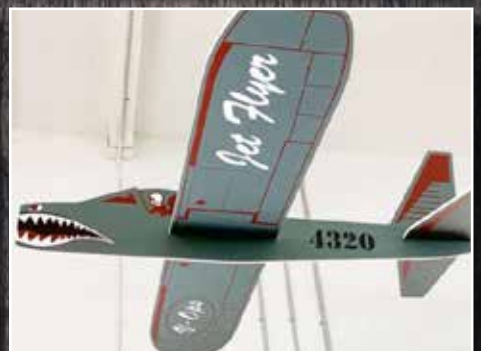

On behalf of West Sound Wildlife Shelter, we welcome you to our **16th Annual Call to the Wild Gala Dinner and Auction celebration** — the Shelter's most important fundraiser event of the year. The money raised tonight will save the lives of wildlife by funding our wildlife rehabilitation center and education programs. Thank you for joining us again this year, albeit virtually and under these difficult circumstances.

As COVID-19 continues to spread, the future has never felt so unpredictable. These are challenging times for us all, and we hope you're in good spirits and health! Right now, we're doing everything possible to sustain daily operations and provide services to our community. While there's a lot of uncertainty, we know that we need to adapt fast to our changing reality.

The Shelter is the only wildlife rehabilitation and education center serving the entire western Puget Sound region. When injured and orphaned wildlife on the Kitsap Peninsula need medical attention, **there is only one local facility it can go to: West Sound Wildlife Shelter.**

After serving the local community for 27 years at our current location, demand for our services has grown dramatically. Last year we treated 1576 patients, responded to more than 6,500 phone calls, and gave unique live-animal educational presentations to more than 9,500 adults and children. The Shelter accomplishes all of this with the equivalent of six employees and a large group of amazing, dedicated volunteers. Unfortunately, the COVID pandemic struck early in 2020 and the Governor's health mandates were released. The Shelter was deemed an essential service and remained open to serve our community. **This year has stretched the Shelter to its financial limits.**

All of the Shelter's activities, including this event, would not be possible without the generosity of you and our community. We depend almost entirely upon donations from individuals and fundraisers like this to carry on our daily operations. The next time you see a raptor soaring above you, know that you are helping to save these majestic animals and countless others that can be rehabilitated and returned to the wild, thanks to your caring and generous support.

AUCTION RULES



GENERAL RULES

1. People wishing to bid are required to register at our auction site. To register, go to www.westsoundwildlife.org. Your card and information must be registered in order to bid on any auction items. At the time of registration, your credit card will be saved and securely kept on file for payment. All transactions will be audited, and within 3-4 business days of the close of the auction, if you have purchased items, the final amount will be charged to your card and the transactions sent for final approval and payment. For those who did not purchase any items, the information from your original swipe will be deleted.
2. How to bid at Greater Giving online bidding:
 - Register your mobile number and credit card information on our registration page in advance of the event or upon arrival.
 - When the auction is open, you will receive an automated 'Welcome' text with your bidder link.
 - After clicking the link in the text, begin searching for packages by name, number, or category.
 - Select the package you wish to bid on.
 - You can Bid the next increment or Bid More than the next increment.
 - If you choose to Bid More you can choose to set your Max Bid. If your max bid is the highest, the system will automatically bid in your favor until you are outbid or until the silent auction closes. If your bid is lower than the highest max bid on that package, you will be prompted to enter a higher bid.

GENERAL RULES, CONTINUED

- To purchase a package at the Buy Now price, select the Buy button.
 - To “watch” a package, select the star icon on the package.
 - To make a donation, select the Donation button on your home screen and choose a pre-set amount or select the Custom Amount button to enter the amount you wish to donate.
 - If you’re out-bid at any point before the silent auction closes, you will receive a text message.
 - To view packages you are bidding on, click the menu button and select Bids.
 - To view packages you are watching, click the menu button and select Favorites.
 - Once the auction closes, the guest with the highest bid will win.
 - Under the Bids area you can check your winning packages.
3. Payment is required to pick up your items. All items will be scheduled for pickup the week of October 12, 2020 at set times.
 4. Purchases may be split between two bidders.
 5. The Auctioneer reserves the right to reject any bid that is a minimal fractional advance over the prior bid. The Auctioneer and the organization reserve the right to add or withdraw, without notice, items to or from the auction.
 6. Some items may be offered subject to a reserve price, a price below which the item may not be sold. If an item has a reserve that is not met, it may be removed from the auction with no successful bidders.
 7. The IRS has granted the West Sound Wildlife Shelter charitable organization status and your payments may be tax deductible as a charitable contribution to the extent provided by law. Generally, you may deduct as a charitable contribution the amount you pay ABOVE the fair market value for an item, including your tickets. Please consult your tax professional for advice.
 8. The purchaser assumes the responsibility to locate and remove purchases from the Shelter. Assistance will be provided at the shelter. Items not picked up within 60 days may be recycled into the next auction or similar event.
 9. West Sound Wildlife Shelter has attempted to describe and catalog all items correctly, but each item is offered as is (in current condition) and where is (in current location). West Sound Wildlife Shelter neither warrants nor represents, and in no event shall be responsible for the accuracy of descriptions provided by the donors, authenticity, authorship, provenance or condition of the items. No statement made in this catalog nor made orally at the auction or elsewhere shall be deemed such a warranty for tax purposes or fair market value. Items have not been appraised unless otherwise noted.
 10. Each person registered as a bidder assumes all risks and hazards related to the auction and items obtained at the auction. Each bidder agrees to hold harmless from any liability arising there from West Sound Wildlife Shelter, its elected and appointed officials, members and employees, the auctioneer(s), the auction company and its agents and employees, the event organizers, sponsors, and/or volunteers connected with the auction.

GENERAL RULES, CONTINUED

11. In your auction catalog, “value” is an estimate of the retail value. Generally, we depend on the donor to provide a reasonable estimate of the item’s retail value.
12. Some items may involve a payout to a vendor who supplied the item, a price below which the item may not be sold. These items are added to the auction to give you a wider bidding selection, and to help the organization earn additional funds. The organization keeps any funds bid above the payout amount. If an item has a payout amount that is not met, it may be removed from the auction with no successful bidders.

RECEIPT OF YOUR WINNING ITEM

Payment is required prior to picking up your items. Everyone wishing to bid is required to register a credit card with Great Giving (go to www.westsoundwildlife.org to register). Your card will be charged after the auction for the amount of your purchases.

Gift Certificate and Gift Cards will be mailed to winning bidders. If pick-up is preferred, please email us at auction@westsoundwildlife.org. All other items will be available for pickup by appointment October 19th-21th, 12:00pm-3:00pm. 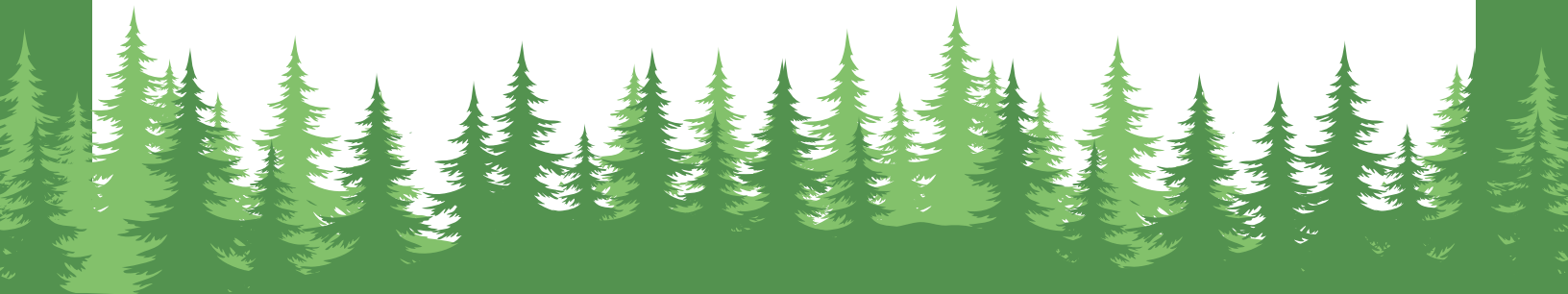
